## **Outcome details**

This outcome was reached by SRA decision.

### **Decision details**

#### **Who does this decision relate to?**

Rachel Bingley-Wakefield, who is not a solicitor, was employed by Chattertons Legal Services Limited whose head office is at 5 South Street, Horncastle, LN9 6DS between 14 September 2020 and 31 July 2024.

### **Summary of decision**

A finding of dishonesty was made against Ms Bingley-Wakefield, and she was made subject to a disqualification order under section 99 of the Legal Services Act 2007.

The SRA has disqualified Ms Bingley-Wakefield from holding any of the following roles in law firms regulated by the SRA:

- Head of Legal Practice



- Head of Finance and Administration
- A manager
- An employee

### **The facts of the case**

On or around 15 December 2022, Ms Bingley-Wakefield electronically copied her clients' signatures from a deed onto two other documents in a conveyancing transaction (namely a contract for the purchase of land and a plan attached to a TP1 transfer). She did so without the knowledge or consent of the relevant clients.

### **Our decision on sanction**

Ms Bingley-Wakefield's conduct breached relevant duties that applied to her as an employee of the firm, namely, Principles 2, 4 and 5 of the SRA Principles 2019.

It was found that it would be undesirable for Ms Bingley-Wakefield to act as a Head of Legal Practice, Head of Finance and Administration, a manager or an employee of a body licensed in accordance with section 99 of the Legal Services Act 2007.

Ms Bingley-Wakefield was disqualified from holding any of these roles.

She was also directed to pay costs of £1,350.
